Course Description

CDRCP is offering an ECE Essentials Course to provide our current and emerging Early Childhood workforce with the necessary and fundamental tools and strategies for success. This 11-week course will commence from September through to November.

The weekly sessions are delivered by subject matter experts in the field and cover a range of topics that include, but are not limited to: child development, effective practices, pedagogy, inclusion, professionalism and more.

Program Structure

In this course, participants will learn key concepts, contribute to discussions, explore videos and resources, engage in reflective activities and consider their own experiences. The content is comprised of both theory and practical components and is offered in various modes of learning (i.e., virtual live, pre-recorded, in-person).

All sessions will include application, visuals/examples, and handouts with key information and additional resources. Participants who successfully complete the 11-week course in full, will receive a certificate via mail to acknowledge their achievement.





Theoretical Fundamentals of Child Development

Format: Pre-Recorded

In the first session of this course, participants will explore the theory fundamentals of child development (Infant-Toddler, Pre-school, Kindergarten, and School-age), as a framework for understanding children's behaviours. We will explore a variety of developmental theories, deepen our understanding of childhood development, and engage in reflective practices to enhance the view of the child.

In Week 3, we will uncover the importance of structured schedules, discuss the educator's role in routines, learn how to create smooth transitions, and utilize effective small-grouping techniques. We will discuss the timing and importance of sanitization and master the art of proactive leadership for seamless classroom flow. Participants will learn how to anticipate situations as they arise and discuss problem-solving techniques to set up for success.
